



# All Signs Point to New Bus Stops



Metro is reimagining the everyday transit experience, starting at its entry point. Over the next two years, 3,700 bus stops across Hamilton County will be upgraded with a bold new design that's clearer, more visible, and built for how people ride today.

Made possible through federal and state grants, this investment goes beyond signage. It also brings 400 new benches and 200 new shelters to neighborhoods, creating more comfortable, accessible, and welcoming places to wait, connect, and go.

## Features

**Dynamic Topper Sign (A):** Makes stops easier to spot and supports real-time updates for riders

**Wayfinding / Location Sign (B):** Helps riders quickly understand where they are and how to navigate nearby connections

**Route Signs (C):** Clearly shows which routes serve each stop for faster, more confident boarding

**ADA / QR Code / Braille Flag (D):** Expands accessibility and provides instant access to information for all riders

**Real-Time Display (Solar-Powered):** Delivers real-time bus arrival information at the stop. Designated for stops with high ridership.

## Funding

\$6.3 million in federal and state grant funding is powering Metro's bus stop, bench, and shelter improvements across the region.

## Partnerships

Students and faculty from the University of Cincinnati's College of Design, Architecture, Art, and Planning (DAAP) played a key role in shaping the design of these new bus stops. The project is also supported by federal, state, and local partners, including the City of Cincinnati, the Department of Transportation & Engineering, Hamilton County, and the Ohio Department of Transportation.
